North—Ram Lal Ganguly's building, Narendra Nath Das's kutcha houses and a foot-path.

South—Harra-Makarkole village road.

East—Dasatina Tank and Lower Primary School house.

West—Saluk Gora.

The area of the temple with its surrounding lands is 30,195 square feet, which is equal to 2 bighas 1 cottah 15 chitaks.

PRESS COMMUNIQUE.

The 3rd February 1919.

IN modification of previous orders on the subject, the Governor in Council has now decided that candidates who were permitted to appear at the Final Licentiate Examination of the State Medical Faculty of Bengal held in November 1916, under the certificates granted by Government under the Transitory Provisions of the Statutes of the Faculty, but who failed in one or two subjects, will be allowed to re-appear at the examination of the Faculty up to and including the examination to be held in November 1919. Such candidates will be exempted from the obligation of undergoing further instruction in the subject or subjects in which they may have failed. The examination to be held in November 1919 will be the last examination under the Transitory Provisions of the Statutes of the State Medical Faculty.

APPOINTMENTS AND TRANSFERS.
