NOTIFICATIONS.

Bankura.—No. 1526P.—3rd February 1931. —In exercise of the power conferred by sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Ancient Monuments Preservation Act, 1904 (VII of 1904), the Governor in Council is pleased to declare the "Dalmadal gun" at Vishnupur in the district of Bankura and the platform on which it is mounted to be a protected monument within the meaning of the said Act.

2. Any objection to the issue of this notification, which is received by the undersigned within one month from the date on which a copy of the notification is fixed up in a conspicuous place on or near the said monument, will be taken into consideration.

No. 1612P.—3rd February 1931.—In exercise of the power conferred by section 20 of the Indian Press and Unauthorised News-sheets and Newspapers Ordinance, 1930, Ordinance X of 1930, the Governor in Council is pleased to authorise the District Magistrate in each district in the Province of Bengal and the Chief Presidency Magistrate in the town of Calcutta to detain any package brought, whether by land, sea, or air, into British India, which he suspects to contain any newspapers, books, or other documents of the nature described in section 4, sub-section (1) of the said Ordinance.

2. In exercise of the further power conferred by the same section of the said Ordinance, the Governor in Council is pleased to appoint the Superintendent or Additional Superintendent of Police in each district, the Deputy Commissioner of Police, Special Branch, in the town of Calcutta, and the Deputy Commissioner in the Chittagong Hill Tracts as the officers to whom copies of newspapers, books, or other documents found in any such package shall be forwarded.
