THE Governor General in Council is pleased to direct that the following should be inserted as rule 37A, in part V of the Ecclesiastical Rules, published with the Department of Education Notification No. 212, dated the 10th May 1913:—

“The number of sittings for which compensation is allowed is subject as a maximum to the number of sittings which the church contains, reckoned at the rate of one sitting for each six superficial feet of the area provided for the accommodation of the congregation.”

**Hooghly.**

- (1) Danish cemetery at Serampore measuring 1 bigha 6 cottahs 8 chitaks or .437 acre, bounded on the north by Pophain Street, south by the lands of Bargir Bagan, east by cemetery lane, and west by the garden lands of late Abdul Haq, surrounded by pucca walls on all sides.
- (2) All ancient structures, all tombstones, monuments, remains or inscriptions within the area enclosed by the said walls.

*No. 2116.—The 11th May 1915.*—Notification No. 440, dated the 25th January 1915, published in the *Calcutta Gazette* of the 27th January 1915, which declared the tombs of Bahram Sakka, Sher Afgan and Nawab Kutabuddin, situated in Pir Bahram Mahalla of Burdwan town, to be protected monuments, is confirmed under section 3 (3) of the Ancient Monuments Preservation Act, 1904 (VII of 1904).
