NOTIFICATIONS.

No. 1121.—The 5th March 1915.—Shams-ul-'Ulama Maulvi Abdul Haq Haqqani, Head Maulvi, Calcutta Madrassa, was allowed extraordinary leave, without allowance, under articles 345 and 339 of the Civil Service Regulations, from the 1st December 1913 to the 8th March 1914 (both days inclusive).

No. 1207.—The 9th March 1915.—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Ancient Monuments Preservation Act, 1904 (Act VII of 1904), the Governor in Council is pleased to declare the temple of Ichai Ghosh, in the zamindari of Hetampore, situated in mahal Gourangapur (Lat Ekdala), within the jurisdiction of police-station Kanksa, in the district of Burdwan, and bounded as follows, to be a protected monument within the meaning of the said Act:—

North—By the Adjai river,

South—By the Gorh Jungle,

East—By Khorabari village,

West—By Damudarpur and Gourangapur villages.

Any objections to the issue of this Notification which are received by the undersigned within one month from the date on which a copy of the Notification is published in a conspicuous place on or near the aforesaid temple will be taken into consideration.

No. 397S.R.—The 8th March 1915.—The following draft of a Notification which the Governor in Council intends to issue under the Sea Customs Act, 1878 (VIII of 1878), is published for the information of persons likely to be affected thereby.

II. The draft will be taken into consideration on the 7th April 1915, and any objection or suggestion received by the undersigned before that date will be considered.

DRAFT NOTIFICATION.

In exercise of the power conferred by section 11 (c) of the Sea Customs Act, 1878 (VIII of 1878), the Governor in Council is pleased to appoint the following places in the Port of Chittagong to be wharves for the landing and shipping of goods:—

- (1) All the jetties controlled by the Assam-Bengal Railway Company, bounded on the north by the Strand Road, on the west by the Mohesh Khal, on the east by Assam-Bengal Railway land.
- (2) Messrs. Turner Morrison & Co.'s pontoons and jetties used by sea-going vessels, bounded on the west by Assam-Bengal Railway Company's land, on the east by a road leading into Messrs. Turner, Morrison's premises, on the north by a road leading to the Assam-Bengal Railway jetties.
- (3) Jetties and pontoons used by the sea-going and inland vessels of the India General Navigation and Railway Company and the Rivers Steam Navigation Company, bounded on the north by the Strand Road, on the west by a khal, on the east by Messrs. Bulloch Brothers' premises.
