ARCHAEOLOGY.

No. F. 11-4|37-F.—In exercise of the powers conferred by Sub-section (3) of Section 3 of the Ancient Monuments Preservation Act, 1904 (VII of 1904), the Central Government is pleased to confirm its notification No. F. 11-4|37-F. (Archaeology), dated the 17th June 1937, declaring the standing Jain image of the Digambar Sect known by its common name "Nagababa" and the various fragmentary stone images and architectural stone pieces placed in open waste land in Khasra No. 83 under the Margosa (Neem) tree at a short distance from the village Ghansore, Tahsil Seoni, District Chhindwara, Central Provinces, to be a protected monument within the meaning of the said Act.

No. F. 18-8|37-F.—In exercise of the powers conferred by Sub-section (3) of Section 3 of the Ancient Monuments Preservation Act, 1904 (VII of 1904), the Central Government is pleased to confirm its notification (Archaeology) No. F. 18-8|37-F., dated the 17th June 1937, declaring the ancient monument described therein to be a protected monument within the meaning of the said Act.

No. F. 18-12|37-F.—As required by rule 2 of the rules published with the notification of the Government of India in the Department of Education, Health and Lands, No. F. 41-1|33, dated the 13th September 1934, the Central Government hereby gives notice of its intention to make the following notification in exercise of the powers conferred by section 20 of the Ancient Monuments Preservation Act, 1904 (VII of 1904) for the information of all persons likely to be affected thereby.
