APPOINTMENTS AND TRANSFERS.

GENERAL.—No. 3986A.—The 24th July 1908.—Mr. A. N. Moberly, Officiating Deputy Commissioner, Sambalpur, is appointed to act, in addition to his own duties, as Political Agent, Orissa Feudatory States, during the absence, on leave, of Mr. L. E. B. Cobden-Ramsay, or until further orders.

No. 4051A.—The 27th July 1908.—Mr. V. B. Cobden-Ramsay, Officiating Joint-Magistrate and Deputy Collector, Hazaribagh, is appointed to act as Deputy Commissioner of that district, during the absence, on leave, of Mr. C. A. Radice, or until further orders.

No. 4066A.—The 28th July 1908.—Babu Surendra Lal Mitra, Deputy Magistrate and Deputy Collector, on leave, is posted to the head-quarters station of the Balasore district.

No. 4076A.—The 28th July 1908.—In exercise of the power conferred by sub-section (2) of section 10 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1898 (Act V of 1898), the Lieutenant-Governor is pleased to appoint Mr. L. Birley, i.c.s., Officiating Magistrate and Collector, 24-Parganas, to be Additional District Magistrate of that district for a period not exceeding six months, and to direct that he shall have, for the period he is so employed, all the powers of a District Magistrate under the said Code.

Ganga Gobinda Chakraverty and by side drain of Sirkerpara Road, on the south by the land belonging to Jadu Nath Sircar, and on the west by the land belonging to Jadu Nath Sircar and Purna Chandra Ghose, is required within the aforesaid village of Rajpore.

DECLARATION.

No. 2788 L.A.—The 27th July 1908.—Whereas it appears to the Lieutenant-Governor of Bengal that land is required to be taken by Government, at the public expense for a public purpose, viz., for the construction of the residence for the Superintendent of Police, 24-Parganas, in the village of Alipore, pargana Magura, zilla 24-Parganas, it is hereby declared that for the above purpose a piece of land measuring, more or less, 1 bigha 9 cottahs 15 chitaks and 33 square feet of standard measurement, bounded on the north and west by the Agri-Horticultural Society's garden, on the east by the compound of the Municipal Office of District No. IV, and on the south by land belonging to the Corporation of Calcutta, is required within the aforesaid village of Alipore.

This declaration is made, under the provisions of section 6 of Act I of 1894, to all whom it may concern.

DECLARATION.

No. 2818 L.A.—The 28th July 1908.—Whereas it appears to the Lieutenant-Governor of Bengal that land is required to be taken by Government at the expense of the East Indian Railway Company for extra sidings for stacking wagons at Ondal, in the villages of Ondal and Serampur, pargana Shergurh, zilla Burdwan, it is hereby declared that for the above purpose a piece of land measuring, more or less, 34 bighas 16 cottahs 1·77 chitaks of standard measurement equivalent to 11·51 acres, bounded on the north by the East Indian Railway Company's land; on the south by the cultivated lands of Rameswar Mondal, Khudiram Mondal, Pratap Karmakar, Krista Tanti, Mohan Roy, and khas patit land; on the east by the paddy lands of Rambistoo Bhattacharjee and khas patit danga and on the west by the East Indian Railway Company's land and khas patit danga, is required within the aforesaid villages of Ondal and Serampur.

Mines of coal, iron-stone, slate or other minerals lying under the land, or any particular portion of the land, except only such parts of the mines and minerals as it may be necessary to dig or carry away, or use in the construction of the work for the purpose of which the land is being acquired, are not needed.
