No. 3097.—The 16th June 1913.—In exercise of the power conferred by sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Ancient Monuments Preservation Act, 1904 (Act VII of 1904), the Governor in Council is pleased to declare the group of temples known as Brindabon Chandra's Math which are situated in the village of Guptipara, within the jurisdiction of police-station Balagore, in the district of Hooghly, and are bounded as follows, to be protected monuments within the meaning of the said Act:—

Hooghly.

North—The track of *Rath*,

South—The Kaibartapara road and waste land belonging to Brindabon Chandra Thakur,

East—Khal and waste land and garden belonging to Brindabon Chandra Thakur,

West—Kaibartapara road.
