APPOINTMENTS AND TRANSFERS.

GENERAL.—No. 10155A.—*The 7th September 1927.*—Mr. C. Bartley, I.C.S., on leave, is appointed to be District and Sessions Judge, Dacca.

No. 10169A.—*The 8th September 1927.*—The orders of the 31st August 1927, posting Maulvi Abdul Latif Chaudhury, Sub-Deputy Collector, on leave, to the Burdwan Division, are cancelled.

No. 10310A.—*The 12th September 1927.*—Mr. Lal Bihari Chatarji, officiating Additional District and Sessions Judge, 24-Parganas, is appointed to act, in addition to his own duties, as Additional Sessions Judge of Jessore, Khulna, Murshidabad and Nadia, during the ensuing Civil Court vacation. He is authorised, under section 193 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, to receive and dispose of all criminal applications and cases except applications for revision under section 435 of the Code, during the absence, on vacation leave, of Messrs. G. C. Sankey, I.C.S., Prabodh Chandra Basu, Rakhal Chandra Sen, I.C.S., Hon'ble Sushil Kumar Sinha, I.C.S., and J. Younie, I.C.S..

Mr. Lal Bihari Chatarji is also authorised, under section 9 (4) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, during the ensuing Civil Court vacation, to sit at Alipore, Jessore, Khulna, Berhampore or at Krishnagar for the disposal of cases arising in any of these districts.
