No. F. 18-16/37-F.—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Ancient Monuments Preservation Act, 1904 (VII of 1904), the Central Government is pleased to declare the old temple of Dharmaraj

at Kumbheshwar in Bhabanipore Union Board within the jurisdiction of the Police Station Rajnagar in the Birbhum District, Bengal, to be a protected monument within the meaning of the said Act.

No. F. 18-23-37-F.—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Ancient Monuments Preservation Act, 1904 (VII of 1904), the Central Government is pleased to declare the ancient monument described below, situated in village Nimbal, Taluka Indi, District Bijapur, Bombay Presidency, to be a protected monument within the meaning of the said Act :—
