APPOINTMENTS AND TRANSFERS.

GENERAL.—No. 365A.D.—The 6th May 1913.—Babu Lalit Kumar Sen, Deputy Magistrate and Deputy Collector, Faridpur, is allowed leave for six weeks, under article 260 of the Civil Service Regulations, with effect from the date on which he availed himself of it.

No. 369A.D.—The 6th May 1913.—Lieutenant the Hon'ble C. A. J. Annesley, Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire Light Infantry, Aide-de-Camp to His Excellency the Governor, is allowed combined leave out of India for five and-a-half months (the first sixty days of which are to be privilege leave) on urgent private affairs, under paragraph 226, Army Regulations, India, Volume II, with effect from the 15th May 1913.
