No. 591Mis.—*The 27th May 1918.*—In exercise of the power conferred by sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Ancient Monuments Preservation Act, 1904 (Act VII of 1904), the Governor in Council is pleased to declare the temple of Basuli and the mound together with fourteen other temples near them containing the “Linga”, image of “Siva”, in the village of Nanoor, within the jurisdiction of police-station Nanoor, in the district of Birbhum, standing on about 2 bighas 2 cottahs 12 chitaks or 0.76 acres of land, bounded as follows, to be protected monuments within the meaning of that Act :—

North—Jatindra Nath Bhattacharji's house.

East—Rishi Pal and Jatindra Nath Bhattacharji's house.

South—Keshab Chandra Goswami's house and Akin Gorain's house.

West—Jatindra Nath Bhattacharji's land.

Any objections to the issue of this notification which are received by the undersigned within one month from the date on which a copy of this notification is fixed up in a conspicuous place on or near the said monuments will be taken into consideration.
