No. 4585 Regn.—The 3rd May 1915.—Under section 2, Act XII of 1880 (an Act for the appointment of persons to the office of Kazi), the Governor in Council has been pleased to grant a *sanad* (license) to Maulvi Abdul Wahed, appointing him Kazi of the police-station Sripur, in the district of Jessore, for the celebration of marriages and the performance of other rites and ceremonies, when application is made to him to perform any such functions.
