NOTIFICATION—By the Government of India, Department of Education (Ecclesiastical).

THE Governor-General in Council is pleased to direct that the following shall be substituted for the existing note to paragraph 4 of the Home Department Resolution No. 6-370-380 (Eccl.), dated Simla, the 9th November 1876, which was published as Appendix A to the Department of Education Notification No. 212, dated the 10th May 1913 :—

Note.—The term “decent order” means that Government will provide for the purchase and planting of trees and shrubs and their upkeep including reasonable expenditure on watering (including, when necessary, the employment of bullocks and attendants), and necessary implements. The outlay on operations having for their object the ornamentation or embellishment of cemeteries or the maintenance of a high standard of gardening, *e.g.*, the provision of annual flowering-plants, should be met otherwise than from State Funds.



No. 127.—The 11th January 1915.—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Ancient Monuments Preservation Act, 1904 (Act VII of 1904), the Governor in Council is pleased to declare the temple of Radha Binode, commonly known as Joydeb, situated in the village of Joydeb Kenduli, within the jurisdiction of police-station Illambazar, in the district of Birbhum, and bounded as follows, to be a protected monument within the meaning of the said Act—

Birbhum.

North, South and West—By the Khas homestead land of the Mahant of Joydeb Kenduli,

East—By the village road of Kenduli.

Any objections to issue of this notification which are received by the undersigned within one month from the date on which a copy of the notification is published in a conspicuous place on or near the aforesaid temple will be taken into consideration.

TRADING WITH HOSTILE FIRMS.

WITH reference to the several licenses granted by the Government of India to certain individuals, firms and Companies to carry on business or to liquidate, as the case may be, under my supervision, it is hereby notified that, in the absence of any express notice by me of prohibition or restriction, it may be assumed by third parties that such licensees have full power to do all acts, matters and things necessary to enable them to carry on business or to liquidate as aforesaid and that it is not incumbent upon such third parties to satisfy themselves that my authority or sanction has been obtained.

No. 123Com.—The 11th January 1915.—In exercise of the power conferred by section 15, sub-section (1), of the Indian Telegraph Act, 1885 (XIII of 1885), the Governor in Council is pleased to appoint the Commissioner of each Division in the Presidency of Bengal to be the authority to determine all disputes that may arise between the telegraph authority and a local authority in his Division in respect of the exercise of any of the powers conferred on those authorities by the said Act.
